

What is a landscape?



A landscape is all the visible features of an area of land, such as the scenery.



How are observations made?



A geographer conducts fieldwork which involves observing the environment around them. They can record what they find using pictures.

Europe

Europe is a continent.

Landscape

A landscape means **an area of land that you can see.**

Physical features

Physical features are features of our world that has been created by nature such as cliffs and mountains.

Observe

To observe is to look at something closely.

Fieldwork

The act of fieldwork is conducting work in the natural environment.

Scenery

The natural features of a landscape considered in terms of their appearance, especially when picturesque.

“An artist paints a landscape; a geographer studies it”




Some geographers, such as Otto Schluter, actually define geography as landscape science. landscapes.
